Note Printing Office, Fitzroy-Approval of Carrying out of Work.-Mr. Groom moved, pursuant to notice, That in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth Public Works Committee Act 1913-1914, it is expedient to carry out the following proposed work:—Erection of Note Printing Office, Victoria-parade, Fitzroy, which said work was referred to the Public Works Committee, and the Committee has duly reported to this House the result of its inquiries thereon.
