- 3. Message from the Senate.—Appropriation (Works and Buildings) Bill 1921-22. Mr. Speaker announced the receipt of the following Message from the Senate:-

The Senate returns to the House of Representatives the Bill for "An Act to grant and apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two for the purposes of Additions, New Works, Buildings, &c., and to appropriate such sum," to which it has agreed without amendment.
