TUESDAY, 19TH SEPTEMBER, 1922.

1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT *RE* TURKISH SITUATION—MOTION FOR PRINTING.—Mr. Hughes, by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the Turkish situation, and, in conclusion, moved, That the statement made by him with reference to the matter, as published yesterday, be printed.
Debate ensued.
Question—put and passed.
3. PAPERS.—The following Papers were presented, pursuant to Statute—
Defence Act—Regulations Amended—Statutory Rules 1922, Nos. 122, 123, 124, 125.
Northern Territory Acceptance Act and Northern Territory (Administration) Act—Foreign Marriage Ordinance—Regulations.
4. POSTPONEMENT OF BUSINESS.—Ordered—That Order of the Day No. 1 be postponed until after Order of the Day No. 2.
5. SUPERANNUATION BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the second reading—Mr. Groom moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.
Mr. Charlton moved, That the debate be now adjourned.
Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.
Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
6. POSTPONEMENT OF BUSINESS.—Ordered—That the intervening Order of the Day be postponed until after Order of the Day No. 3.
7. ELECTORAL BILL (1922).—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.
