TUESDAY, 10TH JULY, 1923.

- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- PRINTING OF PAPER.—Mr. Austin Chapman (Minister for Trade and Customs) moved, That the following Paper, laid on the Table of the House on the 5th instant, be printed :— Tariff Board—Annual Report, to June, 1923.

Question-put and passed.

3. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—

Seat of Government Acceptance Act and Seat of Government (Administration) Act—Ordinance of 1923—No. 5—Recreation Land Leases.

4. COMMONWEALTH SHIPPING BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time— Debate resumed.

Question-put and passed.-Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.
