- 3. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT-ADMINISTRATION IN NEW GUINEA.-Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the Administration of the Mandated Territory of New Guinea.
 - Mr. Charlton (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, also made a statement with reference to the matter.
- 4. COMMONWEALTH SHIPPING BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

New Clause-

On the motion of Mr. Bruce, the following clause, to follow clause 20, was added to the Bill :---20A.--(1.) The accounts of the Board shall be subject to inspection and audit by the Audit. Auditor-General for the Commonwealth.

(2.) The inspection and audit shall be conducted not less often than yearly, and the Auditor-General shall report to the Treasurer the result of each inspection and audit.

Schedule agreed to.

Title agreed to.

Bill to be reported with amendments.

The House resumed ; Sir Neville Howse reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr. Bruce (the Standing Orders having been previously suspended-see p. 59 ante), the House adopted the Report, and the Bill was read a third time.

5. ADJOURNMENT.-Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.

Question-put and passed.
