- 4. COMMONWEALTH BANK BILL (1924).—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time-

(1) to advance upon broad acres,

- (2) to assist co-operative finance in primary and secondary production,
- (3) to assist in land settlement and development, and
- (4) to establish a grain and fodder reserve against periods of drought."
- Speaker's Ruling-The Amendment was ruled out of order by Mr Speaker, on the grounds that in the case of a second-reading stage of a Bill it was not allowable to add words to the question after the House had decided that the words proposed to be left out should stand part of the question, and that an amendment could not be made by the addition of words to the question for reading the Bill a second time.
