#### Statement by Minister

The Minister for Family and Community Services <u>made a statement</u> about the Senate order requiring the Minister for Health and Aged Care to table certain documents about the listing of Celebrex and Voixx and the appointment of the Pharmaceutical Benefits Advisory Committee (no later than 4pm on 27 March 2001)—motion moved by Senator Evans. The Minister indicated that the documents would be tabled as soon as possible.
