## Statement by Minister

The Minister for Regional Services, Territories and Local Governments <u>made a statement</u> indicating that the order (agreed to 9 August 2001) to table all documents held by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade relating to an agreement this year between Australia and Japan to end the port ban on Japanese fishing boats would not be complied with
