Senator McLucas gave <u>notice of a motion</u> to require the Minister representing the Minister for the Environment and Heritage to table certain correspondence and other communications concerning Repulse Bay, the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority or the Representative Areas Program (no later than 3pm on 11 August 2004)

#### Statement by Minister

The Special Minister of State made <u>a statement</u> relating to the order of the Senate [agreed to on <u>5 August 2004</u>] requiring the tabling of the COAG report on bushfire mitigation and management (no later than 5pm on 9 August 2004). The Minister indicated that the government would not comply with the order. Senator Brown <u>made a statement</u> relating to the matter.
