□ Trade Practices Amendment (Personal Injuries and Death) Bill 2003— The message reported that the House of Representatives had disagreed to the amendments made by the Senate. The Senate resolved to insist on its amendments. [The House of Representatives will now reconsider the amendments insisted on by the Senate]

Motion to disallow defeated

The Senate debated a motion to disallow new rule 77 in item [1] of Schedule 1 and new item 10990 in item [2] of Schedule 1 to the Health Insurance (General Medical Services Table) Amendment Regulations 2003 (No. 2), as contained in Statutory Rules 2003 No. 318 and made under the *Health Insurance Act 1973*. The Senate agreed *not* to disallow the rule and item

A notice of motion was given to disallow the Fuel Quality Information Standard (Ethanol) Determination 2003, made under section 22A of the *Fuel Quality Standards Act 2000*—by Senator Allison

Notice of motion withdrawn

A notice of motion to disallow the Migration Amendment Regulations 2003 (No. 7), as contained in Statutory Rules 2003 No. 239 and made under the *Migration Act 1958* was withdrawn

The Senate <u>ordered</u> the Minister representing the Minister for Trade to table the Free Trade Agreement made between the governments of Australia and the United States of America in February 2004 (no later than 5pm on 11 February 2004)—moved by Senator Brown. Later in the day, the Minister for Finance made a statement indicating that the Government would not table the Agreement.
