

Senate Daily Summary

Tuesday 23 March 2004

The Senate met from 12.30pm until 8.09pm

Privilege

The President made <u>a statement</u> relating to a matter of privilege raised by Senator Mackay concerning the apparent contradiction between answers given by Telstra officers at an estimates hearing of the Environment, Communications, Information Technology and the Arts Legislation Committee on 16 February 2004 and statements made in a Telstra document. Senator Mackay gave <u>a notice of motion</u> to refer the matter to the Committee of Privileges.
