Motion to disallow regulations debated

The Senate resumed debate on a motion by Senator Bartlett to disallow the Migration Amendment Regulations 2005 (No. 6) as contained in Select Legislative Instrument 2005 No. 171 and made under the *Migration Act 1958*. The debate will continue on a future sitting day. [The regulations will be deemed to be disallowed if the notice is not agreed to or withdrawn within 15 sitting days after 9 August 2005—ie. by 5 October 2005]
