The Senate met from 9.30am until 7.14pm

Motion to disallow regulations defeated

The Senate *did not agree* to a motion to disallow Schedules 1 and 3 to the Parliamentary Entitlements Amendment Regulations 2006 (No. 1), as contained in Select Legislative Instrument 2006 No. 211 and made under the *Parliamentary Entitlements Act 1990*. [first speaker]

Notice of motion withdrawn

The Chair of the Standing Committee on Regulations and Ordinances withdrew a <u>notice</u> to disallow migration regulations relating to visa applications.

New committee system

<u>Senator Carr</u> asked the Minister for Immigration and Multicultural Affairs why answers had not been provided to questions placed on notice during Budget estimates in 2006. <u>The Minister</u> explained the delay and indicated that answers would be provided.

- □ <u>The 'Slow Food' movement</u>-moved by Senator Nettle
- □ <u>Woodstock-Abydos Reserves</u> in the Pilbara–moved by Senator Siewert
