Statement by Minister

The Parliamentary Secretary for Social Inclusion and the Voluntary Sector (Senator Stephens) made [a statement](#) about the order of the Senate [agreed to on [4 February 2009](#)] requiring the tabling of documents relating to the Department of the Treasury report, *Australia's low pollution future: The economics of climate change mitigation*. The Minister indicated that the release of the documents would cause commercial harm.
