Dear Sir,

Following the 1998 Jederal Election an Inquiry into the conduct of that Election was held and, subsequently, a number of recommendations were submitted to the Australian Electoral Office. Could I ask how many of the recommendations were accepted and will they be incorporated into the rules governing any future election?

There is, though, one-matter that does <u>not</u> appear to have been addressed. The Electoral Commission kindly sent me details of the votes cast for the respective parties in the 1998 Federal Election. It seems that, in view of the information sent to mer, a majority of votes were cast in gavour of the Labour Farty, not the combined Liberal Farty and Mational, Farty, and that, on a two party preferred system, the ALF gained 51% of the votes cast compared with 49% for the compalition.

Despite this the co-alition formed the government, not on the basis of the number of xex votes cast in their favour, but on the number of <u>seats</u> won. Will this factor be considered for the next Federal Election? And, more importantly, will any steps be taken to ensure that the next Federal Government is elected according to the will of the Australian people?

Over the past months the present Frime minister has been saying that he was "democratically elected" "This statement is clearly incorrect if the total number of votes is the criteria. Under the present system of voting it is possible for any Frime@Minister to be elected to that position simply because he or his party or coealition won a majority of seats.

But the question is - will any future Frime Minister represent the majority of Australian electors or a minority? I look forward to receiving your answer.
