## **Taking Parliament to School**

Federal Parliament's Electoral Matters Committee will begin a series of school visits tomorrow in Alice Springs as part of its inquiry into civics and electoral education in Australia.

The Committee will be talking to teachers and students from Centralian Senior Secondary School and Our Lady of the Sacred Heart College (Sadadeen Campus) to examine some of the challenges in providing quality civics and electoral education.

Given successive surveys indicating low levels of enrolment among young people and a general sense of apathy and cynicism towards the political process, the inquiry hopes to find better ways of inspiring and engaging this group.

Committee Chairman Peter Lindsay said "the Australian Government has made Civics and Citizenship Education (CCE) a national priority and all schools are encouraged to include aspects of CCE in their curriculum."

Peter Lindsay said "It's important to bring Parliament to regional and remote schools which, because of their distance from the National Capital, are not always able to see how Australia's democratic institutions work."

These school visits will follow the Committee's visit to Warburton, WA on Thursday 27 July to meet with indigenous community leaders and the teachers and students of the Warburton Ranges Remote Community School. This visit will give the Committee a unique opportunity to bring Parliament to this remote community and highlight some of the key challenges indigenous communities face in teaching civics and electoral education.

The inquiry has received over 100 submissions from a broad range of individuals and organisations, including teachers and schools, Federal, State and Territory parliaments and electoral commissions, academics and governments. Copies of these submissions are available on the Committee's website.

The Committee is a Joint Committee of the House of Representatives and the Senate, and comprises members of the Government, Opposition and the Australian Democrats.
