Educators to give their view on civics

Teachers will have their say on the challenges being faced by Queensland schools delivering civics and electoral education programs when federal parliament's Electoral Matters Committee holds public hearings in Brisbane, Cairns and Townsville next week.

Committee Chairman Peter Lindsay (Member for Herbert, Qld) said, "The committee has heard evidence that the teaching of civics and electoral education can be dependent on the confidence of teachers in teaching the subject matter. Teachers have said to us that teaching a discrete unit is more difficult than teaching aspects of civics and citizenship education as part of other classes."

In Brisbane, the Committee will also hear from the Queensland Commission for Children and Young People and Child Guardian who submit that civic literacy tests should not be the sole measure of young people's knowledge and participation in government and electoral processes.

On Tuesday (24 October), the Committee will then continue its school visits program in Cairns and Townsville. Mr Lindsay said "the Committee has now conducted 10 school visits and forums, hearing the views of young people from all states and territories in Australia. These visits have been a very significant part of the inquiry and young people have had a great opportunity to make their views known loud and clear. It's been especially important to the Committee that it seek the views of students in regional and more remote parts of the country."

The inquiry by a Joint Committee of the House of Representatives and the Senate has received over 100 submissions from a broad range of individuals and organisations.
