Canberra hearing for human rights talks

The Human Rights Sub-Committee of the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade will hold a public hearing with the Australian Council for International Development to discuss Australia's human rights dialogues with China and Vietnam.

"Australia's human rights dialogue process is now well-established with 13 rounds of talks between Australia and China and eight between Australia and Vietnam since 1997," Human Rights Sub-Committee chair Laurie Ferguson said. "This inquiry is a chance to examine the effectiveness of the dialogue process to date".

The focus of the Committee will be on:

- parliamentary participation and oversight;
- involvement of non-government organisations;
- the roles and obligations of participating agencies;
- reporting requirements and mechanisms;
- the monitoring and evaluation of outcomes including an assessment of whether any human rights reforms within those countries have been obtained;
- whether this dialogue mechanism should be adopted with other countries:
- exploring options for alternative human rights mechanisms.
