We are a family dairy farming business at Blighty in the southern Riverina commencing in 1989. We bought a property with an Irrigation Licence as it would be impossible to feed milking cows without water. We have worked extremely hard and with advice from The Department of Agriculture and a full farm plan have improved the efficient use of water by landforming, purchasing outlets for fast watering and recycled drainage. We planted many trees and have always worked to improve the environment. All this at our own expense.

If the Murray Darling Plan is implemented in its present form it will have devastating effects on the whole community as we all depend on each other. We have already had to cope with Dairy Deregulation in 2000 and drought which continued for almost the whole decade. Because of low prices for commodities especially during the Economic Global Financial Crisis, farmers have had to borrow heavily and live on the smell of an oily rag to survive these disasters.

Over the past few months when the rains came and the crops began to look promising, the whole community started to look forward with hope in their hearts that this was the turning point we have all been waiting for and along comes the MDBP.

Many farmers will be forced off their land and the associated businesses, (those which have not already shut their doors), will be pushed to the limit.
