- The importance of collaborative work between local Indigenous staff and non-Indigenous teachers in school settings
- The role of the arts, specifically music, in supporting Indigenous languages and culture
- The high value placed on elders and their knowledge, and their role in developing young people into full and participating members of their community

• Her aspirations for children in the Ti Tree community as people who are strong in their language, well educated, and working in culturally relevant skilled jobs in their community.
