Harmful and noxious substances treaty under review

Federal Parliament's Treaties Committee will be holding a public hearing on Monday, 4 February 2013, to examine a treaty regarding the transport of Harmful and Noxious Substances (HNS).

"The 2010 HNS Convention aims to ensure that compensation for damage or pollution resulting from the maritime transport of HNS is available", the Committee Chair, Mr Kelvin Thomson MP, said.

As part of the Convention, a HNS Fund is to be established so that should damage or pollution from the carriage of HNS by ship occur, prompt, adequate and effective compensation will be available for those persons affected. This fund will be financed by contributions made by those entities that receive bulk HNS cargoes.

"The requirement to pay contributions to the fund will impose a new cost on persons and businesses that will be liable to pay the contributions; namely, the receivers of bulk HNS cargoes," Mr Thomson said.

"This is one aspect of the convention that the Committee will want to examine to see if it is in Australia's interests."

The Committee will also examine two other sets of treaties as listed below.
