Edmund Barton Building, ACT Fitout for the Australian Federal Police

The National Capital Authority (NCA) appreciates the opportunity to provide a submission to the Joint Standing Committee on Public Works regarding this project. The following comments relate to the proposal and a number of issues raised in the submission of the Landmark Apartments of 21 August 2008.

Refurbishment Approval

On 28 February 2008 the NCA approved the refurbishment of the Edmund Barton Building.

National Capital Plan Amendment Status

On 13 February 2006 the National Capital Authority agreed to propose an amendment for Section 9, Barton. The purpose of the draft Amendment is to allow for mixed use development including office, residential, retail facilities and car parking.

From November 2007 to February 2008 the NCA undertook pre-consultation on the draft Amendment. A total of forty-three (43) people representing seventeen (17) lease holders and/or their representatives were consulted regarding the proposed draft Amendment which included the Landmark Owners Corporation.

At the next Authority meeting of the NCA on 6 October 2008 the Authority will reconsider all comments made as part of the pre-consultation process. The Authority will determine if the draft Amendment should proceed to statutory consultation in accordance with the *Planning and Land Management Act 1988* and consultation protocol.
