The Moorebank Unit Relocation (MUR) Project will see the end of the Royal Australian Engineers (RAE) 72 year tenancy at Moorebank and the construction of new facilities for the School of Military Engineering at Holsworthy Barracks. This project has the full support of the Engineer community, serving and ex-serving, and is a tremendous opportunity for the RAE and Army to develop facilities that will enable their training into the future.

The project continues to address heritage issues related to the RAE and significant consultation has occurred to ensure the preservation of heritage items currently on Steele Barracks at Moorebank. Items of particular importance include:
