Re: Inquiry into Cost Shifting and Local Government

The following is a final, short submission made by the Northern Sydney Regional Organisation of Councils with respect to this Inquiry. A reading of the transcripts of various hearings of the Committee leads us to make our submission on two points as follows:

1. Who will speak on behalf of Local Government in any tripartite agreement/s that may be established as a result of this Inquiry?

This issue came up a number of times. It was addressed briefly during the Sydney hearings of the Committee held on 28th April (see pages 716 to 717). The Deputy Chair of the Inquiry, on page 717, stated, "There are over 700 councils and there are at least six more peak bodies of those councils. We have been a little frustrated in this process by the inability of the peak bodies to speak on behalf of all the councils – and we are politicians, we understand politics. So if you say you are going to be there, who is going to be there? You are at COAG but as a nominal voice, in some respects, I would argue. I think it is laudable, but you have to think through who speaks on behalf of 700 very diverse bodies".

This was followed by a variety of comments on this point by participants. Having considered this issue we suggest the following two options be considered:

Comprising the Councils of: Hornsby, Hunter's Hill, Ku-ring-gai, Lane Cove North Sydney, Ryde and Willoughby

Option 1.

That Local Government be treated precisely the same as State Governments who participate as of right. The State Governments do not have to rationalize their numbers to participate and, regardless of what they may say do not represent Local Government interests, they represent their own. The State Local Government bodies are representative of their constituents; they are elected from them and act on their behalf in an entirely democratic process.

With respect to NSW which has two bodies we submit that they be required to address the question of representation as a condition of participation in the process.

If this whole process is, in part, about proposing reforms to relationships between the three spheres of government then the management of the politics of engagements between those spheres should not be beyond satisfactory resolution.

Option 2

It should be noted that this option is very much not our preferred option however it needs to be put.

The Committee could as part of its recommendations include one that provided numerically limited representation for Local Government to participate in the tripartite process. As an example representation could consist of the ALGA (after being appropriately empowered by it's State based constituents) plus two or 3 of the State bases organisations with selection being left to Local Government to determine.

Both of these options have their difficulties but it is imperative that options be explored if the maximum advantage is to be obtained from this process and we commend their consideration to you.

Further to our recent submissions to the inquiry NSROC has updated the data attached to its original submission comparing the distribution of the Financial Assistance Grant.

The analysis, we believe demonstrates the following:

- The minimum grant must be maintained
- Fifteen Councils spread across the entire Sydney region currently receive the Minimum grant. This reflects the impacts of high property values in those areas, combined with the regressive nature of rate-pegging. A reduction in the minimum grant would be extremely deleterious to those Councils, as they have no way of replacing the potential lost revenue while the current NSW State Government regressive rate revenue policy prevails.
- In real terms there has been no increase in the proportion of revenue distributed to New South Wales, notwithstanding that it is the State that has the highest population increase
