Taking control of pest animals

The House of Representatives Agriculture Committee will unveil new ways for Australian agriculture and governments to deal with a multi-million dollar pest animal problem when it releases its report, Taking Control: a national approach to pest animals next Monday (28 November).

The committee Chair, Mr Alby Schultz, said pest animals are a "huge problem for Australian farmers".

"Wild dogs are decimating the sheep industry," Mr Schultz said. "The number of feral pigs roaming the country is in the order of 23 million, which would create a nightmare if foot-andmouth disease broke out here. Pest animals cost the economy more than \$700 million each year.

"Pest animals are having a serious impact on agriculture and the environment and it is time that concerted action was taken at all levels to address this issue."

Members of the House of Representatives Agriculture Committee will hold a media conference at 12.50pm on 28 November in committee room 1R4, Parliament House, Canberra.
