Inquiry into withdrawal of Defence infrastructure from Tarin Kot, Afghanistan

The Public Works Committee is conducting an inquiry into the Multi National Base Tarin Kot (MNB-TK) Remediation Project proposed by the Department of Defence.

On 26 March 2013, the Minister for Defence announced the closure of MNB-TK, Australia's main operating base located within the Uruzgan Province of Afghanistan, by the end of 2013.

As part of the closure of MNB-TK, the Department of Defence is required to undertake remediation activities to ensure that the base, which Australia has occupied since 2005, is returned to Afghan control in a suitable condition. Remediation will include the transfer of suitable Australian infrastructure and facilities to the Afghanistan National Security Force and the deconstruction of all other infrastructure and facilities.

The estimated cost of the project is \$47 million.

The Committee's Chair, Kirsten Livermore MP, said the Committee will receive a briefing on the project and will conduct public and in-camera hearings in April 2012.

"The Committee will scrutinise this important project to ensure that the proposed remediation works will meet the Australian Government's objectives while providing value for money," Ms Livermore said.
