Clean Energy Legislation (Carbon Tax Repeal) Bill 2013 [No. 2] and 7 related bills—defeated on the question that the main bill, as amended, and the related bills be agreed [the bills were considered under a <u>declaration of urgency</u> – <u>statements</u> were made; committee stage continued—2 AG amendments agreed to]

Private senators' bills to be debated

On 14 November 2013 the Senate agreed to a temporary order allowing private senators' bills to be considered on Thursdays. On 17 July 2014 the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Amendment Bill 2014 and the Privacy Amendment (Privacy Alerts) Bill 2014 are scheduled for debate
