Tax Laws Amendment (Combating Multinational Tax Avoidance) Bill 2015—the message reported that the House of Representatives disagreed to the amendments made by the Senate—the Senate resolved not to insist on an amendment and made further amendments in place of certain amendments [the House of Representatives agreed to the amendments made in place of those disagreed to]
