# **Opening of the 45th Parliament**

The Deputy of the Governor-General opened the 45<sup>th</sup> Parliament in the Senate chamber. Following a suspension of sitting, the Governor-General addressed the members of both houses assembled in the Senate chamber. Watch on <u>ParlView</u>

Senator Stephen Parry was elected as President of the Senate, and Senator Sue Lines as Deputy President and Chair of Committees.

The Leader of the Government in the Senate advised the Senate of the Turnbull Ministry and party appointments in the Senate.

The Leader of the Nationals in the Senate, the Leader of the Opposition in the Senate, and the Leaders of the Australian Greens, Pauline Hanson's One Nation, and the Nick Xenophon Team advised the Senate of various party appointments.

The Senate agreed to meet again at 9.30 am on Wednesday, 31 August 2016.
