

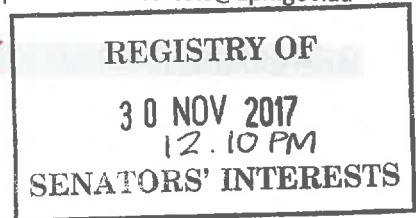

My maternal grandparents left Lithuania prior to the birth of my mother, who was born in Scotland in 1915.

Lithuania issued its first nationality law on 3 November 1989 (**1989 Lithuanian Act**). The 1989 Lithuanian Act conferred citizenship on descendants of persons who were citizens of the Republic of Lithuania prior to 15 June 1940, so long as they had not acquired citizenship of another state. The 1989 Lithuanian Act did not allow for dual citizenship for descendants of Lithuanian citizens who had left Lithuania prior to 1940.

I was born in Scotland on 27 January 1951 and pursuant to the terms of the *British Nationality Act 1948*, I automatically acquired British citizenship at birth.

Accordingly, I was ineligible to acquire Lithuanian citizenship under the terms of the 1989 Lithuanian Act, because I had acquired citizenship of another State (the United Kingdom).

On 23 August 1995, I naturalised as an Australian citizen.

I renounced my British citizenship on 19 January 2007, prior to first nominating for election to the Senate. As I retained Australian citizenship, I remained ineligible for Lithuanian citizenship.

At the time of nomination for the 2007 election and at every election since, I have only held Australian citizenship.

On 1 July 2016, the Lithuanian Law on Citizenship was amended to allow for dual citizenship (**2016 Lithuanian Act**). Article 9 of the 2016 Lithuanian Act provides for an indefinite right to acquire citizenship of Lithuania for descendants of Lithuanian citizens that left Lithuania prior to 1940.

Article 38 of the 2016 Lithuanian Act requires an application to be submitted to the Minister of the Interior in order to seek to acquire Lithuanian citizenship.

I can confirm that no application to become a Lithuanian citizen has ever been made by me or on my behalf.

Accordingly, I have never acquired Lithuanian citizenship.

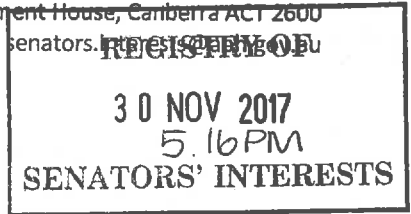

In July 2017, I was made aware that I had been placed on a "Register of Italians Resident Abroad - A.I.R.E." I subsequently resigned from the Ministry and the Senate referred the matter to the High Court sitting as the Court of Disputed Returns on 9 August 2017.

As an abundance of caution, I took the steps to renounce any possible foreign citizenship, or entitlement to foreign citizenship in August 2017.

The court found that:

"The evidence of Italian citizenship law is contained in the joint report of Maurizio Delfino and Professor Beniamino Caravita di Toritto ("the joint report"), both of whom are practising Italian lawyers. From the joint report it emerges that Senator Canavan's status, if any, as an Italian citizen does not arise from any step taken by his mother in 2006 but rather from the circumstance that his maternal grandmother had not renounced her Italian citizenship at the date of his mother's birth.

"Registration with A.I.R.E. is distinguished in the joint report from a request for the declaration of Italian citizenship, which is required to follow the steps set out in a circular issued by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1991 ("the circolare"). The authors of the joint report state that "[o]nly after the request made by the individual for the recognition iure sanguinis of the Italian citizenship has been ascertained to be well grounded, may the consulate issue the relevant certificate of citizenship". They observe that it is not known if "the investigation and controls" referred to in the circolare have been carried out. They state that the A.I.R.E. certificate issued by the Mayor of the Municipality of Lozzo di Cadore "should not per se be considered a recognition of Italian citizenship": under the circolare only the interested party, who must be of age, can apply for citizenship.

"They conclude that the more reasonable interpretation of Italian law, in line with the adoption of the "subjective conception of citizenship" under the Italian Constitution, is that the administrative steps described in the circolare (which are expressed to apply to applicants for Italian citizenship arising from events before the commencement of the law of 1992) are matters of substance, amounting to a prerequisite to the "potential" citizenship right being activated.

"Senator Canavan has not applied for a declaration of Italian citizenship. On the evidence before the Court, one cannot be satisfied that Senator Canavan was a citizen of Italy. The concluding section of the joint report suggests that he was not. Given the potential for Italian citizenship by descent to extend indefinitely – generation after generation – into the public life of an adopted home, one can readily accept that the reasonable view of Italian law is that it requires the taking of the positive steps referred to in the joint report as conditions precedent to citizenship."

speaking and there is consequently no appeal against a negative decision. Furthermore, given the principle of separation of powers, the judicial branch has no authority to overrule a naturalisation act. In this regard, the Constitutional Court ruled that even though it may review formal laws such as the naturalisation laws, it would not be able to do so without calling into question another fundamental constitutional principle, namely the sovereign competence of the legislature to decide in this case.³⁶

Next to the naturalisation and the declaration, the CNB also included a third, non-automatic way to acquire Belgian citizenship, i.e. the option procedure. This possibility of opting for Belgian citizenship, which was reserved to persons who were considered to have a strong link with Belgium, by their birth, their filiation or their residence in Belgium at a young age,³⁵ was abolished by the Act of 4 December 2012. The option procedure was also available in the case of marriage with a Belgian, possession of Belgian status (*possession d'état de Belge*)³⁶ and re-acquisition of Belgian citizenship. While the first and the last category have now been subsumed in the larger declaration procedure,³⁷ the possibility to obtain Belgian nationality on the basis of '*possession d'état*' has been deleted with the act of 4 December 2012, without any further explanation.

Loss of Belgian citizenship

Just as with the acquisition of Belgian citizenship, different modes of loss can be distinguished. A special mode of loss is the forfeiture of nationality as a penalty for wrongdoing (see below).

Until 2007, the adult Belgian person who acquired a foreign citizenship on his or her own initiative was legally considered to have renounced Belgian citizenship and therefore lost his/her citizenship (art. 22, § 1, 1° CBN)³⁸. This ground of loss was not free of criticism, as foreigners acquiring voluntarily Belgian citizenship were on the other hand not required to lose their nationality of origin³⁹. In 2006, the legislator put an end to this asymmetry by

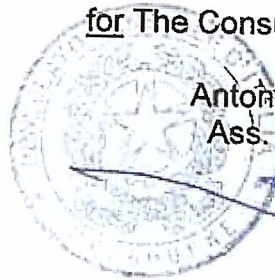



STATUTORY DECLARATION

I, Sam Dastyari, of [REDACTED], in the state of New South Wales, General Secretary of the Australian Labor Party (NSW Branch), hereby make the following declaration according to the *Statutory Declarations Act 1959*:

1. I was born on 28 July 1983 in Sari, Iran. My name at birth was Sahand Dastyari.
2. My family relocated to Australia in 1988 when I was five years old and I have resided in Australia since that time.
3. I became an Australian citizen on 24 June 1996 when I was 12 years old. I formally changed my given name from Sahand to Sam on 8 August 2000 by Deed Poll with the NSW Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages.
4. I have no intention of residing in Iran in the future nor do I have any affinity or allegiance to the Islamic Republic of Iran whatsoever. I will not obey any order that the Government of Iran may issue in regards to its citizens including any orders in relation to military service. I also have no intention of accessing any privileges or entitlements that may be available to Iranian citizens.
5. I consider Australia to be my home and where my affinity and allegiance lies.
6. I became interested in politics at a young age and officially joined the Australian Labor Party (**ALP**) in 1999.
7. I have been employed by the ALP for the past seven years and have held the position of General Secretary of the Australian Labor Party (NSW Branch) since August 2010.
8. When I decided to pursue my political career in the Australian Federal Parliament, I requested the advice of Counsel on behalf of the ALP (NSW Branch). The ALP (NSW Branch) instructed Mr Gerald Ng, of Selborne Chambers in Sydney to provide advice in relation to the procedures the ALP may take to ensure candidates for a Federal election would not be disqualified from sitting in the House of Representatives or the Senate. Mr Ng's advice was to the effect that a person who holds dual Australian and foreign citizenship should take reasonable steps to renounce their foreign citizenship.
9. As I had no affinity and allegiance to Iran I decided to renounce my Iranian Citizenship.
10. Mr Ng emailed me a copy of his Memorandum of Advice on 11 March 2013 and referred me to Ron Kessels of Fragomen to obtain advice regarding the process to renounce my Iranian citizenship.

11. I contacted Mr Kessels on 12 March 2013 to explain my situation and seek his advice. I also forwarded him a copy of Mr Ng's Memorandum of Advice on 13 March 2013.
12. Mr Kessels emailed his professional services agreement to me on 21 March 2013 along with an outline of the steps that would need to be taken to formally renounce my Iranian citizenship and a list of the documentation I would need to gather.
13. I engaged Fragomen to assist me in this respect on 27 March 2013 and I immediately started to gather the requested documents. I also asked Mr Kessels to also arrange translation of the relevant application forms as I cannot read or write Farsi. This would also assist Mr Kessels in understanding my answers as I understand he also does not understand Farsi.
14. On 4 April 2013 Mr Kessels sent me an email to let me know that he expected the English translations of the application forms that day or the next and would send them on to me. I replied via email to advise that I had also located my Iranian ID card and Birth Certificate.
15. On 5 April 2013 Mr Kessels emailed me the relevant translated application forms for renouncing my citizenship as well as for applying for an exemption from Iranian military service. He advised that it was also a requirement that my wife complete these forms as well. The relevant forms were:
 - a. Application to Renounce Iranian Nationality
 - b. Questionnaire to Renounce Nationality
 - c. Table of Exits and Entries to the country
 - d. Recognisance Letter
 - e. Form for Purchase of Military Service Exemption.
16. Mr Kessels also advised that he would need my original documents to arrange certification and translation.
17. On 15 April 2013 I delivered the following documents to Mr Kessels office:
 - a. Iranian Birth Certificate
 - b. Iranian ID Card
 - c. Iranian Passport
 - d. Australian Passport
 - e. Document for Travel to Australia
 - f. Change of Name Certificate
 - g. Australian Citizenship Certificate
18. On 23 April 2013 I emailed Mr Kessels the completed English versions of the Recognisance Letter, Application to Renounce Citizenship and Questionnaire for Applicants for myself only.
19. On 29 April 2013 Mr Kessels and I spoke over the telephone. We agreed that one of my family members would translate my completed application forms

back to Farsi so we could lodge the application with the versions in both English and Farsi.

20. On 30 April 2013 Mr Kessels emailed a confirmation of our conversation and listed the outstanding documents I still needed to gather.
21. I responded to Mr Kessels email on 1 May 2013 confirming I would work on gathering the outstanding information.
22. On 14 May 2013 I emailed Mr Kessels to advise that I had gathered all of the documents. I attended his office on 27 May 2013 to sign the application forms in his presence and provide all of the documents I had gathered so far for the application to be prepared. There was some further documentation I needed to gather and prepare regarding right to ownership of property in Iran.
23. I again attended Mr Kessels office on 3 June 2013 to sign a Declaration regarding my rights to property in Iran in front of Jane Goddard who is a Notary Public.
24. On 6 June 2013 Mr Kessels emailed me a copy of the draft renunciation letter addressed to the Islamic Republic of Iran which would accompany my application for my consideration and comment. Following our conversations Mr Kessels emailed me a copy of the finalised version of the renunciation letter for my consideration on 23 June 2013.
25. My application was then completed with all application forms and supporting documentation. I attended Mr Kessels office on 18 July 2013 to sign the renunciation letter that accompanied my application. I then arranged to courier the application via DHL to my lawyer in Iran, Mr Tavakol Abdollahi Avanaki from the Fragomen office. The package was couriered to Mr Avanaki on 19 July 2013 after I signed the DHL Sanctions Warranty and Indemnity Letter.
26. I understand that the package was delivered to Mr Avanaki on 23 July 2013. Annexed hereto is a copy of the DHL tracking summary from their website.
27. On 7 August 2013 I received a letter from Mr Avanki confirming that the documents that had been sent to him had been submitted to the Refugee and Citizenship Office of the Iranian Foreign Affairs Ministry but that he had not yet received a response. He confirmed that he would continue to follow up on my behalf.
28. On the basis of the above steps, I believe that I have taken all reasonable steps to renounce my citizenship of Iran as required by the High Court in *Sykes v Cleary* (1992).
29. In addition to my extensive efforts to complete the Iranian Citizenship renunciation process, I hereby, with immediate effect, formally renounce my Iranian citizenship, including all rights and privileges that may be possessed as a citizen of Iran.

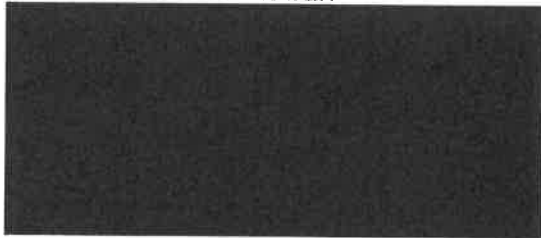





Dear Mr Farrell,

I refer to your application to renounce British citizenship. From the information you have provided it does not appear that you would be eligible to hold British citizenship.

British citizenship is normally acquired by birth in the United Kingdom or for anyone born prior to 1 January 1983 by legitimate descent from a father born in the United Kingdom. From 1 January 1983 under the provisions of the British Nationality Act 1981, British born women were entitled to transmit their citizenship to their children born overseas but this was not made retrospective.

Although in certain circumstances British citizenship can be acquired through a British born grandparent this does not apply in your case. For you to acquire citizenship through your grandfather, your mother would have to be born in a place that was considered a British colony under the British Nationality Act. Although Australia formed part of the Crown's Dominions it was not considered a British Colony for nationality purposes. Therefore your mother would be considered a British citizen by descent, not by birth. British citizenship that is acquired by descent cannot be transmitted to a further generation born outside the United Kingdom.

As you are not automatically a British citizen it does not appear that you would need to make an application for renunciation.
