Britain

Please find attached correspondence from the UK Home Office which confirms that I did not acquire British citizenship by descent from my British mother and maternal grandparents.

Yugoslavia

In relation to Yugoslavia, I did not acquire Yugoslavian citizenship by descent from my father.

I was born in Australia in 1960. My father was born in Yugoslavia and my mother was a British citizen born in the United Kingdom.

Under Yugoslav Nationality Law, a child born abroad only automatically inherited Yugoslav citizenship if *both* their parents were Yugoslavian citizens. As only *one* of my parents was Yugoslavian, I was not captured by this provision.

Where only one parent was a Yugoslavian citizen, the child could become a Yugoslavian citizen by being registered as a Yugoslavian citizen prior to his or her 18th birthday or by permanently settling in Yugoslavia prior to his or her 18th birthday.

I never applied to register as a Yugoslavian citizen and no such application was ever made on my behalf. I also never resided in Yugoslavia.

Accordingly, I never acquired Yugoslavian citizenship.

In any event, the State of Yugoslavia is no longer in existence and it is impossible to be a citizen of a country which does not exist.
