b) Senator FIERRAVANTI-WELLS - Would you take that on notice. Also in relation to the Senior Dental Program, could you give me some information in relation to the levels of uptake? Please take that on notice, if you could, and if you could also indicate to me whether you are aware of any inappropriate access to both these items?

Answer:

a) Medicare Teen Dental Plan statistics are publicly available on the Medicare Australia website (under Item number 88000) by state and age group, at www.medicareaustralia.gov.au/statistics/mbs_item.shtml.

Attachment 1 identifies for example the dollar benefits paid by state for the 2010 calendar year.

The next level of data is by Local Government Area, of which there are 689 areas in Australia. Reports for data in respect of specific jurisdictions would require specific reports to be developed.

b) Medicare Australia administers the Chronic Disease Dental Scheme which commenced on 1 November 2007.

Under the Chronic Disease Dental Scheme, eligible patients are able to receive up to \$4,250.00 in Medicare benefits over two consecutive calendar years. Details of the scheme are available at:
