Senator Siewert asked:

From the beginning of this financial year to date, could you provide details of payments associated with the Northern Territory (with the exception of township leasing) which are coming out of the ABA? Could you provide the figure and nature of the grants, and any other payments that have come out of the ABA?

Answer:

From the beginning of the financial year to 31 January 2012, payments totalling \$97.263 million have been made out of the Aboriginals Benefit Account (ABA) (this excludes costs associated with township leasing). The vast majority of monies paid out of the ABA have been for payments to the Northern Territory land councils for administrative purposes, payments to the land councils for distribution to royalty associations, and grant payments made for the benefit of Aboriginal people living in the Northern Territory.

The following table details the monies that have been debited from the ABA to the 31 January 2012 under the various subsections of Section 64 the *Aboriginal Land Rights* (*Northern Territory*) Act 1976 (the ALRA).
