Written Question on Notice

Senator Boyce asked:

What were the recency of practice requirements in each jurisdiction before National Registration and Accreditation?

## Answer:

The Department of Health and Ageing is aware that prior to the introduction of the National Registration and Accreditation Scheme, all jurisdictions except New South Wales required nurses to have nursing experience in the preceding 5 years before application for registration or to have satisfactorily completed a refresher course or training in general nursing.

New South Wales had no recency of practice requirements. The requirements were that an applicant had been previously registered and that the registration was properly granted on the basis of qualifications actually possessed by the applicant at the time of previous registration.
