The approved indications for prescription medicines that have been registered in the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods (ARTG) can be obtained from the publically accessible ARTG database at

In the case of antipsychotic medicine risperidone, the indication approved by the TGA is: Treatment of schizophrenia and related psychoses. Short-term treatment of acute mania associated with bipolar 1 disorder. Treatment of behavioural disturbances in dementia. Treatment of conduct and other disruptive disorders in children (over 5 years), adolescents and adults with subaverage intellectual functioning or mental retardation in whom destructive behaviours (e.g. aggression, impulsivity and self-injurious behaviours) are prominent. Treatment of behavioural disorders associated with autism in children and adolescents.
