Senator Ludlam asked:

Can you provide any detail on the decline in Independent Living Units?

## Answer:

Independent Living Units (ILUs) are a specific form of rental accommodation for low income, low asset older people, that were constructed with Commonwealth subsidies between 1954 and 1986, appropriated under the now ceased *Aged Persons Home Act 1954* (Cth).

It is estimated that around 32,500 dwellings were built under the *Aged Persons Home Act 1954* over this period of time. In 1986, Commonwealth funding for this program ceased. FaHCSIA therefore does not have detailed information on the current status of all the ILUs built under the *Aged Persons Home Act 1954* (APHA).

More recently, Independent Living Units have been overtaken by other policies and forms of accommodation such as the Australian Government's ageing in community policy, significant Commonwealth investment in social and affordable housing, state and territory policies aimed at housing older people, and increasing numbers of retirement village dwellings.
