# Indigenous and non-Indigenous employment cycles

Senator SIEWERT:...You gave in answer to some questions I asked previously around the figures of people cycling in and out of employment a figure against streams, which was really useful. Are you able to give me that against Indigenous and non-Indigenous criteria? Ms Taylor: I would have to take that on notice. Senator SIEWERT: I know you would. Ms Taylor: Yes, I think we can. Senator SIEWERT: That would be really useful because the figures were quite telling in the number in streams 3 and 4 that have come back into the process. I would like to know if that is reflected for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people as well. Ms Taylor: I will take that on notice.

## **Answer**

As at 30 November 2012, 20 per cent of job seekers returned to the JSA caseload 26 weeks after being exited following the achievement of a 26-week employment outcome. (Please refer to DEEWR Question on Notice EW0634\_13, from the 2012–13 Senate Standing Committee on Education, Employment and Workplace Relations' Supplementary Budget Estimates hearing).

The percentage for Indigenous and non-Indigenous job seekers are 25.3 per cent and 19.7 per cent respectively.
