**Question:**

In light of recent calls by the Guild to suspend the Home Medicines Review program within community pharmacy settings, how is the Department advancing the recommendations Home Medicines Review Qualitative Research Project? In particular, is the Department investigating the possibility of Home Medicines Reviews led by healthcare professionals such as Aboriginal health workers and nurses, as recommended by the researchers?

**Answer:**

A number of recommendations following the 2008 Campbell Research & Consulting Report (Campbell Report) were implemented under the Fifth Community Pharmacy Agreement.

These include the introduction of direct referral in 2011 and the introduction of Medicine Use Reviews (MedsCheck) which is an in-pharmacy service that commenced nationally in July 2012.

In addition, work continues on the development of a hospital referral pathway to a Home Medicines Review in the immediate post-discharge period, which will be introduced in 2013.

The Department of Health and Ageing and the Pharmacy Guild of Australia continue to consider recommendations arising from the Campbell Report.
