#### **Question:**

a) I refer to HS 44 concerning red tape reduction. What definition of red tape reduction or deregulation is DHS using?

- b) What red tape reduction or deregulation expenditure savings target has been set for the DHS. What is the DHS staffing implications of the red tape reduction?
- c) What areas of the DHS have been identified for red tape reduction or deregulation?

#### **Answer:**

- a) The definition of 'regulation' set out in *The Australian Government Guide to Regulation* is 'any rule endorsed by government where there is an expectation of compliance'.
- b) The Government has not publicly announced targets for individual portfolios. Currently, the department has assigned an SES officer to head the deregulation unit, supported by five staff members: two at Executive Level 2; two at Executive Level 1; and one APS 5. Resourcing for the unit, including staffing levels and classifications, will vary from time to time depending on the volume and nature of the material the unit is required to action.
- c) Deregulation activity is predominantly aimed at reducing procedural and administrative red tape for those that interact with the department.
