Household assistance comprises Clean Energy Advance; Clean Energy Supplement; Low Income Supplement; Single Income Family Supplement; and Essential Medical Equipment payment.

Until the MOG last year, it was paid under the responsibility of five different policy departments and two delivery agencies.

The estimated cost of household assistance in 2013-14 is around \$1.8 billion with 6.3 million customers receiving payments.
