Does the SSAT agree this could be cost prohibitive to a majority of people?

Are there any other options available for my constituent to pursue her complaint? I note that a number of matters my constituent wishes to address do not relate to the decision, but the process of the Tribunal?

If a person has provided false/omitted information at hearings that influenced the decision of the Tribunal, what opportunities does the other party have for redress? Are there other options than through the courts?

Answer:
