These questions relate to a story by Samantha Maiden that appeared in The Sunday Telegraph on 1 February 2015, titled Childcare rebate scheme is failing, with big business facing 1.5 per cent tax levy to pay for reform, the story said:

"But in a move that will anger big business, the Abbott Government will ask Australia's 3000 largest companies to help pay for the overhaul by keeping in place the 1.5 per cent levy that was designed to pay for paid parental leave."

And:

"The Sunday Telegraph understands the \$3 billion paid parental levy will remain in place to help pay for childcare reform. Australian Chamber of Commerce and Industry Kate Carnell slammed the decision."
