## **Question:**

What pathology tests does Australia have to identify Bartonella henselae, Neoehrlichia's spp., Clostridium histolyticum, Rickettsia, Leptospira inadai and Babesias, Anaplasmas, Ehrlichia, Francisella?

#### **Answer:**

The majority of bacteria and the protozoan referred to in the question can be identified in Australia. The in vitro diagnostic approaches to diagnosis would include culture on artificial growth media for some, as well as nucleic acid amplification assays for the more fastidious bacteria. Infections caused by some of the bacteria referred to in the question can also be diagnosed serologically.
