### **Question:**

1. Is it correct that the Government has three breeding facilities for non-human primates in Australia?

- 2. How many primates do the facilities have?
- 3. Are the primates at these facilities used solely for research?

#### **Answer:**

1. The National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) provides direct funding support to the two national non-human primate breeding facilities. These are the National Non-Human Primate Breeding and Research Facility (macaques and marmosets) and the National Baboon Colony (baboons).

There is an owl monkey breeding facility in Queensland; however, this facility is not funded by NHMRC.

- 2. Information provided by the national non-human primates breeding facilities is as follows:
  - Baboon:165 (as at 19 February 2016)
  - Pig-tailed Macagues: 167 (as at 23 February 2016)
  - Long-tailed Macaques: 76 (as at 23 February 2016)
  - Common marmosets: 343 (as at 23 February 2016)
- 3. The national non-human primates breeding facilities have confirmed that the animals are used solely for research purposes.
