The *Therapeutic Goods Act 1989* contains provisions under section 18A to allow for the importation and supply of unregistered therapeutic goods in the event of an emergency so that goods may be stockpiled as quickly as possible in order to create a preparedness to deal with a potential threat to public health that may be caused by a possible future emergency; or so that goods can be made available urgently in Australia in order to deal with an actual threat to public health caused by an emergency that has occurred.
