Priority one of the fund is about capacity-building activities, support for drug and alcohol services. So it is not specific to Indigenous services. In 2011-12, WA had 11 organisations funded to deliver 11 projects, at a cost of \$1.7 million. Under priorities two and three of the fund, which are Indigenous specific-they are either for Indigenous organisations or for organisations that provide services to Indigenous people. Under those two priorities in 2011-12 \$7.2 million is being allocated to 12 organisations.
