#### **Question:**

On the 10 May 2011, Minister for Human Services at the time put out a media release announcing a new initiative called Case Coordination and the expansion of Local Connections to Work.

- a) The media release stated that case coordination would be rolled out progressively to 44 locations over the forward estimates. In how many sites has case coordination been rolled out to, to date?
- b) What types of assistance do people received under Case Coordination?
- c) How many people have been assisted?
- d) How many people have been assisted by case coordination by location and by types of assistance?
- e) Has the number of job seekers assisted continued to increase since May 2011?
- f) Is there anything the Department has learned from the program about the type of assistance that is effective in helping long term unemployed people back into the workforce?
- g) How many job seekers were assisted through Local Connections to Work by location?

#### **Answer:**

a) Case Coordination is currently being trialled in 19 locations. The 2011–12 Case Coordination locations and implementation dates are shown in Table 1 below:

b) Case Coordination helps people who experience difficulty accessing services and support in their community. Front line staff spend time with customers to identify the services they need to achieve their goals and aspirations, including those that will improve their capacity to participate in work, education and training.

The assistance provided is tailored to the needs of the customer. Depending on the customer's needs, it might mean that they're linked to health or housing related services. Alternatively, it might link them directly to an education or training provider.

Case Coordination applies needs-based assessment and strengths-based principles to assist customers to identify their needs and connect to services and supports in their local community.

Case Coordination supports more appropriate and targeted customer referrals and follow-up of outcomes with community sector, local and state government providers.

- c) Nationally, 8,162 people have been assisted by Case Coordination from the commencement of the trials on 5 September 2011 to 31 May 2012.
- d) Overall customer numbers per site is provided in Table 1 above.
   The type of assistance provided is tailored to the needs and circumstances of the

customer. Customers are provided with assistance to access services and support in their local communities. The service categories that customers have been referred to are listed in Table 2 below.

- e) Yes, the number of job seekers assisted has continued to increase since the rollout of Case Coordination in September 2011, with 4,706 job seekers assisted as at 31 May 2012.
- f) The department considers that it is too early in the life of the trial to make definitive observations about the types of assistance that is effective in helping people back into the workforce. Learning to date includes:
  - Customers participating in the program almost universally greet the extra support offered by Case Coordination with enthusiasm.
  - The response from community service providers about Case Coordination has been positive and feedback from service providers is that this approach will generate improved outcomes for shared customers.
    - This is based on the department's better understanding of the services they offer and the extra time Case Coordination funding allows the department's staff to encourage participation in support activities and follow-up on referrals.
- g) Between 1 July 2011 and 31 May 2012 Local Connections to Work in 14 locations has assisted 3,783 job seekers. Table 3 provides a breakdown of job seekers assisted by location.
