#### Answer:

- a) The department's hospitality expenditure for the period 1 July 2011 to 31 May 2012 was \$60,585.21 (including GST). The department is unable to provide the level of detail requested as the work involved would require a significant diversion of resources from other departmental operations. Guidelines are in place to ensure appropriate spending on hospitality. Hospitality spending is only approved when it is demonstrated that it will achieve a benefit to the department, the number of staff and non-staff members must be limited to those whose presence is required, and associated costs must be reasonable and appropriate.
