# Question:

- a) Can you help me find what total quantum of funds has been allocated to the initiative and then over each financial year (in a Budget sense)?
- b) Do you have any information about the indicative indication of what the expected take-up rate might have been for each state and territory?
- c) What is the total take-up to date in each of the states and territories?

### Answer:

a) The telehealth incentives available for aged care facilities are part of the broader telehealth incentives program, Connecting Health Services with the Future: Modernising Medicare by Providing Rebates for Online Consultations, which is jointly funded through Outcome 3 (Access to Medical Services) and Outcome 10 (e-Health). Total funds available during the active phase for this initiative are:
