#### Senator Fifield asked:

Can you provide a breakdown of the positions, roles and responsibilities of staff working on the NDIS?

#### **Answer:**

At 28 May 2012 there were 53 staff in four Groups working on the NDIS. The profile of staff is as follows:

- development of necessary legislation.

#### Design and Engagement

- Advisory Group secretariat;
- community engagement, including secretariat for expert groups and National Disability and Carers Alliance funding;
- design elements including consideration of entitlement, eligibility criteria, and control and choice strategy; and
- design pathway, including for clients, sector and agency.
